As the only deposit library in Japan, the NDL acquires all materials published in Japan, preserves them as national cultural heritage and compiles catalogues of these publications in database and other formats. The NDL Digital Collections is the main digital portal that enables users to search and view a variety of resources, collected and stored by the NDL. 
Getting started

- 1. Go to the Library homepage at http://library.leeds.ac.uk/ or to the "Learn" tab in Minerva
- 2. Type National Diet Library into the Search Library box
- 3. Select and access the National Diet Library Digital Collections from the results list

Searching the NDL Digital Collections

The default display language is English and the search results will be displayed in Japanese. You can switch the display into Japanese at the top right-hand corner of the website.

Prepare your search statement in Hepburn Romanisation, 漢字, ひらがな or カタカナ. The default search setting is searching items available online. Retain this setting for your search.





Refining the result

The search will bring you to the results page. Use the following options to refine the results:

- Use the "Refine your search" feature and select the relevant options, e.g. publication year.
- Sort the result by title, creator, date and call number
