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JUDGING YOUR OWN WORK

Have you been critical in your writing? (This is a starting point, not a comprehensive list)

DESCRIPTION

- 1. What is the assignment/question at hand?
- 2. Why is this problem/question being looked at?
- What is the purpose of the assignment?
- What are you expected to show/demonstrate? (look at your assignment brief and marking criteria)
- 3. Have I identified relevant concepts, theories or principles?
- 4. What is my overall argument/conclusion? Is it clearly stated?
- 5. Have I stated reasons for my argument?
- 6. Have I provided evidence to support my reasoning?





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ANALYSIS

- 1. Have I used academic/appropriate sources?
- 2. How sound is the evidence? Is it reliable/relevant?
- 3. Are there any assertions in my assignment that are unsupported?
- 4. How convincing is my argument? Why (not)? Could it be more convincing?
- 5. Is there internal logic in the argument? How coherent is it?
- 6. Have I considered different viewpoints?
- 7. Is the language used too emotive?
- 8. Has something been omitted? What?

EVALUATION

- 1. Have I answered the question?
- 2. Have I identified the strengths and weaknesses between different viewpoints/theories etc?
- 3. Have I drawn a logical conclusion?
- 4. Have I made connections between sources?
- 5. Have I combined or reformulated arguments/evidence from various sources to create new/more developed point of view
- 6. Have I stated my position on the subject? Have I shown what I think about the arguments or ideas presented
